What is unauthorized radio operation?

Unauthorized Radio Operation Federal law generally prohibits the "use or operation of any apparatus for the transmission of energy or communications or signals by radio" without a license issued by the FCC.

What happens if you run a radio station without an FCC authorization?

Anyone found operating a radio station without an FCC authorization can be subject to a variety of enforcement actions, including seizure of equipment, imposition of monetary forfeitures and criminal penalties. Authorized exceptions

Do I have to allow inspection of my radio equipment?

One of the requirements as a licensee, or non-licensure subject to the Commission's Rules, is to allow inspection of your radio equipment by FCC personnel. Whether you operate an amateur station or any other radio device, your authorization from the Commission comes with the obligation to allow inspection.

How can public safety reduce RF interference?

To minimize disruption, the public safety community must work together to address and mitigate the growing problem of radio frequency (RF) interference. Effects of interference can range from mild disruption or delays in data throughput to a complete loss of service.

Q: What can happen to me if the agent determines that I am using illegal or unauthorized equipment? A: There are several different ways that this situation can be handled.

The Bureau works with federal, state, and local public safety agencies to resolve harmful interference to public safety communications and critical infrastructure communication systems.
